TRAIL ETIQUETTE

The Collingwood Trails Network is a multi-use accessible trail system for pedestrians, dog-walkers, cyclists—and in winter, snowshoers cross-country skiers and snowmobilers (on designated trails only).

Please adhere to the etiquette code shown below and share the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

- Show courtesy to all trail users
- Stay on the trail to preserve natural vegetation and private property
- Stay to the right of the trail, and obey all posted signs and warnings
- If you stop, do not block the trail
- *Wheels yield to heels*—pedestrians always have the right of way
- Cyclists ride defensively and in control
- When overtaking others, pass on the left and sound a warning by bell or voice
- Do not litter. Take out what you bring in
- Keep dogs on a leash at all times
- *Stoop and Scoop!*
